HAINESPORT BUTTERFLY GARDEN ESTABLISHED

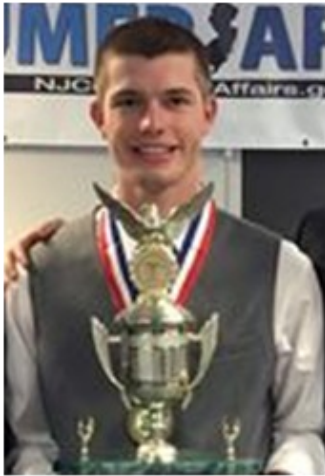

Remember: **Don't Wait – Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years.**

PREVENTION



ACFI Breakers and Outlets can prevent **50%** of residential home fires.



Each year **2,400** children in the US are treated for injuries caused by outlets. **1/3** of parents do not have outlets childproofed. Install **Tamper Resistant Receptacles**.



470,000 counterfeit smartphone batteries were recalled in 2010 due to burn and fire hazards. Purchase electronics at reputable retailers.



3,300 home fires originate from extension cords each year. Heavy reliance on extension cords is a sign to have more outlets installed.

The **CPSC** found **47%** of electrocutions could be prevented with **GFCI** protection in homes.



Frequently **tripped circuit breakers** or blown fuses and crackling, sizzling or buzzing from outlets can be signs of an overloaded circuit. **47,700** home fires in the US are caused by electrical failure or malfunction each year.

What is Suspicious Activity?

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate terrorism or terrorism-related crime. This includes, but is not limited to:

Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Eliciting information: A person questions individuals at a level beyond curiosity about a building's purpose, operations, security procedures and/or personnel, shift changes, etc.

Observation/surveillance: Someone pays unusual attention to facilities or buildings beyond a casual or professional interest. This includes extended loitering without explanation (particularly in concealed locations); unusual, repeated, and/or prolonged observation of a building (e.g., with binoculars or video camera); taking notes or measurements; counting paces; sketching floor plans, etc.

Some of these activities could be innocent—it's up to law enforcement to determine whether the behavior warrants investigation.

Reporting Suspicious Activity

To report suspicious activity, contact your local law enforcement agency. Describe specifically what you observed, including:

Who or **what** you saw; **When** you saw it; **Where** it occurred; and **Why** it's suspicious.

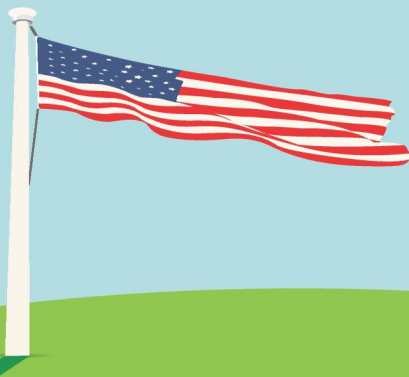

WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR OLD TV

REMEMBER, TVS AND COMPUTERS ARE BANNED FROM LANDFILLS



- ***NEVER SET THEM OUT FOR TRASH!***

- If you buy a new TV, see if the retailer will take your old one.
- Goodwill Donation Centers work with an Ewaste Recycler to take non-working, intact, TVs and computers for recycling.
- The following towns have ewaste dropoffs for their residents ONLY: Bordentown City, Evesham, Florence, Maple Shade, Medford Twp., Mt. Laurel, Pemberton Twp., Shamong, Tabernacle and Wrightstown. *(Some of these towns also offer curbside pickup by appointment - call your town for details).*
- Residents may bring up to 2 computer monitors/TVs to the County Resource Recovery Complex in Mansfield. There is a \$20 fee for more than 2 of these units. Other computer parts and electronic equipment are accepted for free.

The situation is very volatile and more sites could close. Check with a location before bringing your ewaste to them or visit burlcorecycles.com for updates.

Urge your legislators to pass the Ewaste Bill (S981/A2375) to bring back free, convenient ewaste recycling!

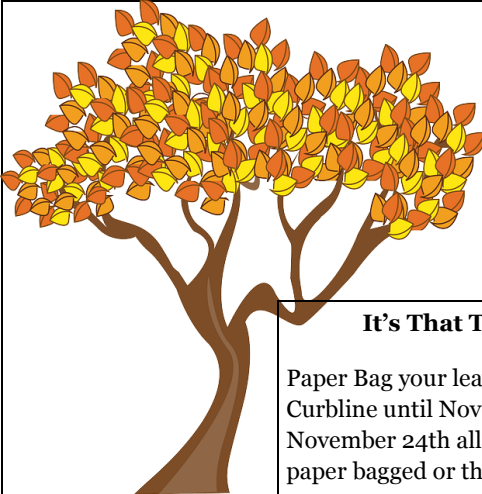

**Where Did Veterans Day Come From?**

On June 28, 1919, WWI had officially ended with the Treaty of Versailles, in the Palace of Versailles in France. However, the fighting continued for an additional seven months and finally ended with an armistice, or a peace agreement, between the Allied Nations and Germany on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, on November 11. The day was commemorated the following year on November 11, as Armistice Day, and was intended to dedicate a day to remind nations to seek peaceful relationships between one another, in hopes that we will never again be divided.

As many of us know Wars continued and young men and women responded to the call, making sacrifices, so we, as Americans, could enjoy our freedoms.
