The Municipal Clerk is often the initial contact between residents and municipal government. The core duties of the Municipal Clerk include:

1) secretary of the municipal corporation 2) secretary to the governing body 3) CAO of all elections held in Hainesport Township 4) Chief Registrar of voters in the township 5) Administrative Officer. Some of the specific duties include being the custodian of records, legal advertising of public meetings of the governing body, bids and ordinances and administering oaths of office.



From the Desk of Mayor Tony Porto





Starting in January, the township committee brought in new legal counsel and a fire official to better serve our residents. By bringing the fire official position "in-house" rather than through the prior shared service agreement, the township was able to save money on salary, while also improving service for our residents and business community.

Upon the January departure of the prior Administrator/Clerk, the Township Committee began an open and competitive hiring process to hire the best person for our community. In April, we welcomed to Hainesport a well-qualified and experienced Administrator/Clerk Paula L. Kosko to lead our Hainesport Township team.

On policy matters, the township committee has approved several changes that seek to reduce the cost of municipal government, repeal excessive regulation upon businesses, and improve the quality of life in our neighborhoods.

Starting in February, the Township Committee approved Ordinance 2017-1, an ordinance which ends medical benefits coverage for municipal elected officials. Then in June, the Township Committee approved Ordinance 2017-4, an ordinance with no increase in salary for Township Committee members. There has been no increase in Township Committee member salaries since 2007. At the July meeting, Ordinance 2017-5 was approved to end an obsolete regulation upon businesses regarding alarm systems, which the



Bulk Items - Televisions, computers, white goods (major appliances) can be put out on Mondays for pick-up by Public Works staff. Please call 609-267-2730 to schedule for Monday pick-up of these items only. Furniture will

be picked up on Thursdays with your trash. Please try to limit one bulk item per week with your household trash.



The Fire Prevention Bureau responsible for enforcing Uniform Fire Code for businesses and for resale inspection and certifications for one and two family dwellings.

Recreational Open Fire Burning

The "General Forest Fire Act" (NJSA 13:9 et al.) requires that before having any fire within a forested area, you must contact the nearest Forest Fire Service office to request a permit. You may also need a permit from the local fire official or NJ Division of Fire Safety.

Recreational permits are issued free of charge and should be requested at least 10 days in advance.

Safety Precautions

Never burn when the wind is high. Live sparks can travel several hundred feet downwind.

Never burn during drought or high fire danger, or when the woods and vegetation are extremely dry.

Check for burning restrictions at: www.njwildfire.org

Have a 5' fire break of mineral soil completely around the fire.

Keep water and shovel or rake handy.

Squad members are alerted for emergency calls by pocket pager units, supplemented by a cell phone notification system. There are approximately 15 active volunteers that donate countless hours to respond to local emergencies as well as provide mutual aid support to surrounding communities. The squad responds to an average of 80 calls each month! Accelerated certification is available to registered nurses and prior EMT's. Additional volunteers are needed to continue this vital service. - 1. Paddle is solid wood or graphite and the ball is plastic
- 2. Serve is made underhand
- 3. Games are played to 11 points, win by 2
- 4. After the ball has bounced once in each team's court, may volley the ball or play it off of the ground

Hainesport History Highlight

Officer William Wurst

End of Watch: Friday, March 28, 1975

Officer William Wurst of the Hainesport Township Police Department and Patrolman Donald Aleshire of the Mount Holly Police Department, were shot and killed by a sniper on Garden Street in Mt. Holly. Officer John Holmes was paralyzed and passed from his injuries in 1992.

Officer Wurst, 24 years old, was a Vietnam War veteran, serving as a Military Police Officer. He served with the Hainesport Police Department for two years. At the time of his passing, he was survived by his parents and twin brother Jim.

William Wurst grew up in Rancocas Woods and graduated from Lenape High School in 1969. He also worked in construction and as a part-time bartender at "Franks" which is now known as Dunleavey's. His hobbies were scuba diving and woodworking. He was one of the first to obtain the rank of Eagle Scout in the area.

Officer Wurst's cousin, Cheryl Wurst, resides in Southampton and attends annual memorials in honor of her cousin and Officers Aleshire and Holmes, which are held in Mt. Holly and Westampton.

New Jersey State Police agreed no longer served any purpose. At the August meeting of the township committee, Ordinance 2017-8 was approved to establish procedures regarding abandoned properties to address ongoing concerns of our residents and keep our community a great place to live.

The 2017 municipal budget was the first budget in decades to reduce the municipal tax levy. The budget cut municipal taxes by 3%. The tax levy was reduced by over fifty-seven thousand dollars, while maintaining services for our residents. The Hainesport Volunteer Fire Company received an additional \$28,000 in the municipal budget to purchase fire safety equipment to protect our community. In standing with its policy of sound budgeting, the township committee also allocated \$357,000 to the capital improvement fund, so that funds will be available in the future to purchase equipment and to maintain municipal infrastructure and roadways.

As a township committee, we are currently working with our administration to seek county, state, and federal grants which will enable us to improve Hainesport, without raising property taxes.
