

The Burlington County Sheriff's Department in partnership with the Burlington County Human Services Department and the Burlington County Health Department operate Hope One Burlington County. The Hope One mobile access unit offers critical support for persons and their families struggling with addiction and related issues. The main goal is to prevent drug overdoses and deaths by providing linkages for treatment and recovery support services. This is a critical first step in putting those suffering on the road to recovery and wellness

Hope One staff provide linkage to peer to peer recovery specialists and treatment facilities, provide Narcan trainings and distribute free Narcan kits. Partnering with the county's Health and Human Services departments, they meet additional needs in the community by providing communicable disease testing, on-site photo identification, free toiletry kits, and much more.

In addition to addiction and recovery service, Hope One Burlington County is a resource for individuals who have become homeless. Toiletry kits, blankets and various other necessities are available, thanks to many generous donations from the community and businesses throughout Burlington County.

Many individuals that are suffering from addiction and/or homelessness often lack photo identification which is needed to access treatment facilities and/or services provided by the Burlington County Housing HUB. The Hope One mobile unit is outfitted with equipment to print photo identification upon confirmation of the individual's identity. In many cases, this identification now offers the individuals the ability to access treatment, housing and other services that were not available to them without proper identification.
