Wouldn't it be nice to enjoy a home away from home, just around the corner? With its recent "facelift," that's exactly how you'll feel about the Kenneth Street Community Center, where many, like the Girl Scouts, senior citizens, and Story Time tots, gather to attend events that build community. Named for Kenneth Street, who generously served Hainesport residents for years as its mayor, the Street Community Center boasts eye-catching renovations, including new carpets, windows, and front door.

By way of history, the building opened in 1965 and served as Hainesport Township's municipal building. Decades later, in 1998, the Township purchased the Yost Farm property at 1401 Marne Highway for the purpose of constructing a new municipal building and community park. In 2002, the current municipal building was dedicated, and the Street Community Center came to be. Many local non-profit, youth, social, and civic organizations and clubs utilize the Street Community Center for meetings, training programs, and small events. The center is also available to the Hainesport Emergency Squad for in-house nighttime duty crews. Additionally, the Recreation Commission utilizes the center for many recreation programs and partnerships throughout the year.

The many recent renovations to Hainesport's community building reflect the center's value and importance. Last year's renovations include repainting of the inside by the Public Works Department and installation of new carpeting. This year, Friant's Inc. installed new windows and a new front door. New landscaping beds with new plantings will soon adorn the perimeter of the building. Furthermore, plans to refurbish the surrounding concrete walkways are on the horizon.

The Street Community Center occupies a valuable place in Hainesport's history. Our local taxes fund the center's improvements, ongoing maintenance and associated costs for the present and future use and benefit of all Hainesport residents. Consequently, if you haven't visited the Street Community Center lately, drop by 100 Broad Street, and bring your family and friends along to admire its transformation!
